USGA RULES GOVERN ALL PLAY

Except as modified by these local rules

-  Cart paths, paved maintenance roads, water control boxes, restrooms, lightening shelters, stakes supporting trees, the pump station on Lakes 9, and all flower beds are considered immovable obstructions. Relief: nearest point of relief (stance and swing) plus one club length not nearer the hole. Rule 24.2
-  Unmarked boundary fences bordering the golf course are considered out of bounds at nearest inside points of fence at ground level. Rule 18-2
-  Out of Bounds is marked by white stakes or existing fences. Local rule in effect determining the point where the ball went out of bounds, find the nearest fairway edge no closer to the hole and dropping within two club lengths with a two-shot penalty.
-  Local rule classifies the sprinkler head as immovable obstruction (rule 16.1) and the player takes relief by dropping the ball in a relief area based on the nearest point of complete relief. Sprinkler heads close the putting green (interference exists if an obstruction is on the players line of play, and is within two club lengths of the putting green, and is within two club lengths of the ball)
